As a Caring for Kids Network (CFKN) partner, you will be invited to come around the partnership table (in person or virtually) to meet with the school's principal, school liaison, other organizational champions, and the CFKN partnership director.



As you meet with one another, you will hear the principal's goals for the school, which may help support students, families, and school staff. Together, you will discuss projects and



brainstorm ways your partnership can best support the goals of the schools. Collaboration is key to a successful partnership, as partners work together to meet goals and ensure projects are completed. Relationships form between you, the school staff, students, families, and other community partners!





Caring for Kids' Four-Step Process:

The Caring for Kids school partnerships are facilitated through a simple four-step process. The process provides the framework to bring the unique needs of the school and the resources of the partners together to help the school and students achieve their goals. YOUR PARTNERSHIP ROLE

The partnership process is simple:

- As the Organizational Champion, you will attend at least 4 meetings during the school
 year to hear the principal's goals and discuss projects to help reach those goals. It's
 helpful to engage one or more people from your organization who may attend with you or
 in your place if you are unable to attend a meeting. Partnership meeting notes also will be
 sent out after each meeting.
- Participate in one or more projects during the school year. Collaborate with other
 organizations to help complete the project. For instance, several organizations may
 commit to providing volunteers and/or food for a student party, a family engagement
 activity, or a staff luncheon. All contributions are significant, no matter the number of
 volunteers or amount of resources you can provide.
- Track your organization's
 involvement in the partnership by
 keeping a Goals Summary
 personal copy. Record the number
 of volunteers and/or estimated
 value of material resources or
 direct financial contributions (cash
 or check) to the school. At the end
 of each semester, you will receive
 an email with a reporting link to
 provide this data. Information of all
