
Our **mission** is to mobilize community organizations in partnership with schools to inspire hope and help prepare children to impact their world.

CARING FOR KIDS 4-STEP PROCESS

The Caring for Kids school partnerships are facilitated through a simple four-step process. It provides the framework to bring the unique needs of the school and the resources of the partners together to help the school and students achieve their goals.

Our end goal: To build strong, healthy partnerships that are equipped for long-term success and self-ownership.

PARTNERSHIP ROLES

- **District Liaison:** Provides a systematic approach for districts as they work towards and maintain self-sustaining school partnerships.
- **Principal:** Sets the course for the partnership by identifying school goals, attending meetings, and providing ongoing vision. The Principal will eventually facilitate meetings.
- **School Liaison:** Supports the Principal in communications and coordination of partnership meetings. The Liaison is also the contact person for the school.
- Organizational Champion: Attends the partnership meetings to represent their organization. The Organizational Champion is responsible for casting vision to their leadership team regarding the school partnership and assisting in mobilizing volunteers for school projects. They also will work in collaboration with other partners to organize and implement school projects, as well as track/report volunteer and resource data for their own organization.

KEY COMPONENTS OF A SUSTAINABLE PARTNERSHIP

Relationships

Caring for Kids Network believes that relationships matter and that everything we do flows from these relationships. When Principals and School Liaisons invest in the relationships of those

involved in their partnership, they help build trust within the group and help to foster a culture of collaboration. In the same way, the more partners build relationships with the staff, students, and families, the greater trust is developed with the entire school community. Once trust is established, partners are better equipped to help transform the lives of the students and their families.



Collaboration



Partners can accomplish more together than one organization can accomplish on their own. When partners work together on projects, everyone has ownership and feels valued. Through collaborative efforts partners stay committed longer to the partnership, ensuring long-term sustainability.

Goal Setting

Each school partnership brings resources and volunteers to help support projects that tie into principal's goals. Identifying high-level goals helps everyone stay focused and provides a way to measure success. Instead of trying to meet all the needs of the school, partners can focus on a few projects with excellence.
